Extended school provision – Breakfast club and late leavers.

- Breakfast and after school provision is available for all children/parents who require - with usual costs applied. Starts 3rd Sept. 8:00am and until 5:00pm each evening. Ring office to arrange provision.
- Parent to walk child to hall door (between Class 4/5) for drop off/sign in and to avoid walking through school. Staff to collect from door.
- Children will be collected from their year group class/teacher to attend after school provision.
- Parents should ring the gate buzzer when they come to collect and the child will be brought out to them.



How to drop my child off safely.

Walk through main gates to designated drop off /pick up area on drive. This will be clearly marked out for year group parents. Teachers will direct first few days.

****PE days****

On the days your child has PE we have decided children can come to school in their PE kits. Please ensure they have their Kingsmoor cardigan/sweatshirt to keep them warm and wear black/navy/grey joggers if cold outside. They will need to wear daps or trainers on these days. A coat should also be brought. This is to avoid changing in school and bringing in items from home. Also enables kit to be washed regularly. Please see below for this term's PE days.

Swimming Each Year group will now receive 1 term of swimming per school year. A separate letter will follow early next week with regards to this.

Autumn term - Year 6, Year 1 and Year 3 Starts Thursday, 10th September.

What will your classroom/school building look like?

- Class 1 and 2 (EYFS and Year 1) will still incorporate free flow play. Year 1 children will sit in small groups.
- Years 2-6. As per Gov guidance all desks will face the front and you will sit next to a friend in your Year group. Your teacher will help with this when you come in.
- Coats and bags and book bags will be hung up in the cloak room. Water bottles on your desk.
- Excess furniture has been removed.
- Soft furnishing and toys have been removed.
- You will see lots of posters in classrooms around the school. Reminding of social distancing and handwashing.
- Each child will be provided with a basket/bag/or pencil case of equipment that is for each individual.
- Equipment will be sanitised at the end of the day. And desks/surfaces cleaned regularly – and before lunch.
- Children will enter and exit their classrooms through the outside doors.
- There will be markings around the paths/corridors to help you keep social distance.
- Every classroom has a new interactive smart board!

Toilets

- Each class will have allocated toilets that their year group will use.
- Only one child will be allowed in the toilet at a time this will be monitored by staff and cleaned throughout the day. Paper towels used - bins emptied during day.

Handwashing

Handwashing remains extremely important. We will do this at specific times of the day. When you get to school, after breaks, before lunch, before you leave.

Respiratory hygiene

pupils encouraged to use a tissue to cough or sneeze and use bins for tissue waste ('catch it, bin it, kill it!)

Avoid Touching your face

Hair should be tied back to avoid children touching their faces unnecessarily.

Please explain the importance of these points with your child and give regular reminders to ensure they understand.

Forest school-Thursdays – Y1/Y2/Y3/Y4

Mrs Clarke will be running Forest school throughout this year.

Years 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be starting this first half term. 10th September. They will require outdoor clothing/waterproofs if poss/wellies or old boots. (Further info to follow.)

Lunchtime

EYFS/Year 1/Year 2 – will receive their universal free school meal. (EYFS from 14th Sept – Group B and 21st Sept Group A when they first stay for lunch– this continues when full time)

Children will eat in the hall in their Year group.

Lunchtime is happening a little earlier 11:45 with some year groups having their playtime first! This is so all the children are not in the same space all at once.

KS2 (Year 3, 4,5,6) Any child who would like to order a hot meal will be able to do so. These will start week commencing the 21st September. The office will send out menus for the children to order from when we return.

Free school meal children in KS2 will have their meals provided from the 3rd September.

KS2 children should bring a packed lunch from the 3rd September and their own water bottle.

Playtimes – morning breaks and lunchtime.

Children will play in their Year groups and they will be allocated a particular part of the school to play in!

EYFS – Their outside area

Year 1 – (Class 1 /2 outside area – separate time.)

The field – if dry and safe, Our new track!

The playground, The drive

The year groups will go to play at different times to accommodate everyone safely.

We will provide equipment for each group which can be sanitised easily and for you all to have fun with!



Behaviour and expectations

It is extremely important that all children follow our school's behaviour policy which reflects our Kingsmoor code. The governors have approved a new 'Behaviour policy' for September 2020 – with clear expectations for the children. Parents will receive full information regarding this upon our return. An amendment has been written linking to COVID-19 – and the importance of hygiene and expected behaviours in school.
