Dear Parents, Carers,

I am extremely pleased to be writing to you with information to prepare parents and pupils for our full reopening of school to all pupils on Monday, 8<sup>th</sup> March.

Although this period of lockdown has posed a number of challenges to all families, I am encouraged with how our school community has supported each other in such a positive manner and above all continued to 'do our very best' during these unprecedented times. Once again – Thank you and very well done!

The pupils throughout this last year have displayed a huge amount of resilience and I am confident that during this last period of lockdown the implementation of daily Zoom lessons for Literacy, Phonics and Maths has enabled the pupils to be immersed with high quality teacher input and a continuity of sequential lessons in the core subjects and a range of foundation subjects through accessing the blog. The work handed in so far has been collated in school folders and myself and the teachers have been really impressed at the effort and commitment by each child. Well done! Above all, the ability to maintain positive relationships amongst staff, peers and their cohort has also hopefully supported your child's mental health and well-being, bringing a smile to their faces at some point during each day!

Thus said, there is no substitute for face-to face classroom teaching especially during the Primary school years and all staff are looking forward to welcoming all the pupils back into school to resume our 'normal' teaching practice. Teachers will spend the first few weeks supporting your child to readjust back into school and ensure they feel happy and settled. This provision will continue to run for ALL children if required. Please let the office know when you will require this service.

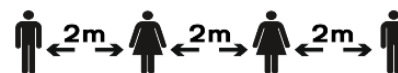

**UNIFORM** – Please ensure all children wear correct uniform on the days when they do not have PE or Forest School. We appreciate footwear may be problematic at this point so please do let us know if this is the case and allowances will be made until shops fully re-open.

**PE days** – children to come to school in their PE kits – jogging bottoms/leggings/jumpers are necessary as is still chilly!

### **Swimming**

### **Lateral Flow Tests**

Kingsmoor staff are now undertaking the lateral flow test 2 times a week. This coincides with the days they work in school. It also includes supply staff and external coaches.

Families of primary school children will be able to undertake lateral flow tests in your home. (According to recent government guidance).
