Kingsmoor Primary School Sporting Achievements in 2018-2019

Sport at Kingsmoor continues to be very popular with the children across the school. Attendance at extra-curricular sports clubs is consistently high. Kingsmoor has attended numerous local district (Sedgemoor) sporting events and from these have qualified numerous times to participate in the county finals and represent Sedgemoor.

Key achievements this year include:

- The school entered 2 girls football teams in the ESFA Football tournament for the 4th time due to the popularity of girls football
- Kingsmoor football team competed in the Bridgwater Football League and came in 2nd place. The team also entered the local ESFA tournament.
- Many good placings in the Sedgemoor Cross country League (approximately 30 schools competing). Kingsmoor came 5th overall
- Kingsmoor participated in the Sedgemoor Tag Rugby Tournament
- Children received free cricket coaching (from Somerset County Cricket) for years 1 to 6
- Upper Key stage 2 competed in 2 rounders tournaments
- 2 teams took part in the Sedgemoor Cyclo-Cross training with 1 team qualifying for the County games and coming 2nd
- 2 teams took part in the Cycling team pursuit, 1 team qualifying for the County Games coming 4th
- Kingsmoor took part in the Sedgemoor area indoor athletics, qualifying and coming 2nd in the County Games
- A year 3/4 and Y5/6 team took part in Athletics Quad kids at local and county games.
- Three Gymnastic teams (Year 1/2, 3/4, and 5/6) competed in the local competitions with one of the teams qualifying for the County Games
- Higher numbers of children are participating in sports clubs
- 24 children attended a Bikeability cycle training course at the school gaining level 2 accreditation from the Somerset Road Safety Team.
- A team of Year 5/6 took part in the local swimming gala.
